ANDREW D'TED' ELLIOTT

Andrew Elliott was born in Basford on 29 July 1963 and is usually known as 'Ted' and occasionally as 'Boom Boom' and was a very dependable, right hand, top order batsman and occasional wicket keeper after joining KCC from Clifton Village CC in 1982 and a great club servant usually away from the limelight in a 'Mr Fix It' capacity - his most recent successful accomplishment was the construction of a Scorebox (photo left with Chris Read, Notts &

numbering at the new home ground down at Platt Lane following the move after 73 years from the Rectory Field. Ted's practical mind, calm approach and high industry proved an invaluable and cherished club asset

over a long period of time, and he was something of a raconteur at club functions. Ted served as Club Chairman from 1994 to 2002 and during this period brought in the first Club Sponsor and then Chaired the Club Development Sub Committee that led KCC to be awarded the English Cricket Board's ClubMark certification.

On the field Ted made the 5th most appearances of any player in the 1st XI with 296 games and the 5th most in any XI for the club with 480. His highest score of 122 not out was made for the 2nd XI against East Bridgford *CC* on 15 August 1987 and he also made a further 27 half centuries out of a total of 7921 runs which is the 4th most career runs by any batsman at any level for the club and his 4540 runs at 1st XI level places him 6th on the all-time list and he has also featured in nine century batting partnerships. With 172 catches, many taken keeping wicket behind the stumps, Ted has the second most in the history of the club. He was Batsman of the Year on three occasions in 1992, 1994 & 2000, 2nd XI Batsman of the Year in 1988 and won the Clubman of the Year Trophy in 1994 & 1996. Ted also Captained the 2nd XI in 1989 and then off and on between 2007 and 2014 and for the 2014 season coach in Junior teams.

Ted's younger brother Peter Elliott played with the club occasionally in the 1980/90s but



both Ted's sons Liam (photo left) & Ben Elliott (photo right, warming up before a T20 Cup match at Trent Bridge) have become long serving members. Liam joined in 1999 and has subsequently featured prominently as a 2nd XI bowler and Sunday XI captain. Ben making his debut in 2001 quickly became an established 1st XI batsman, sometimes



wicket keeper but especially in the field he is arguably one of the best fielder's in the history of the club, athletic, quick across the ground with a penetrative throw and safe hands - 74 catches snared before moving to Essex to

Behind the scenes Ted's mother and father in law, Jean & Cliff Anderson were loyal, hardworking and hardly ever missed watching a match - Cliff (photo right) serving as Club Secretary from 1994 until his death in 2014 and was twice awarded Clubman of the Year in 1993 & 1998 and made Honorary Vice President in 2012. Jean was the doyen of all tea ladies and became an Honorary Vice President in 2016 until her passing in 2018.



Ted's wife Lorraine, another hard worker behind the scenes served as Club Welfare Officer 2015 & 2016. Ted & Lorraine both retired from the club at the end of the 2017 season.
