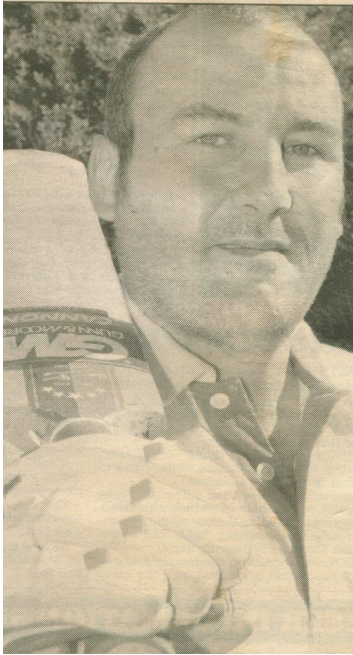

The former Daily Mirror reporter and union official was well known among journalists in the East Midlands and helped train one of The Topper's news team.

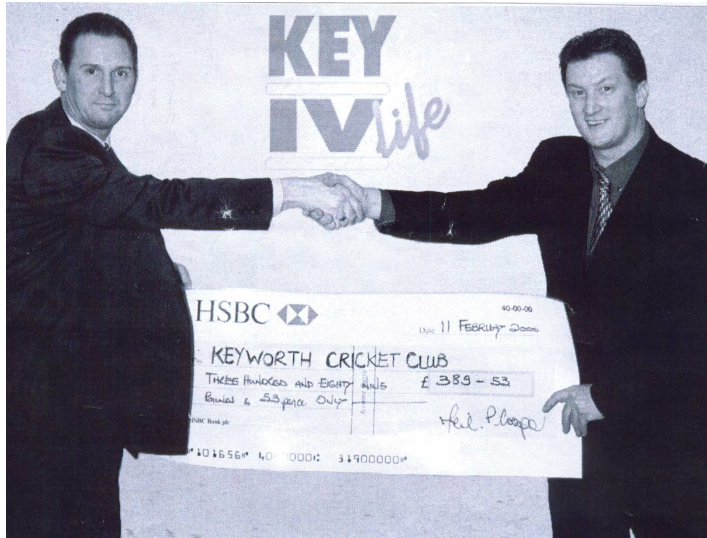
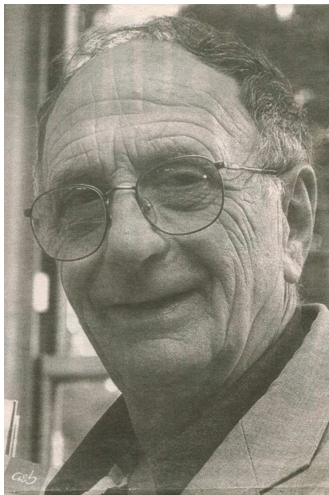
Frank died in June last year after spending his retirement writing a series of crime novels.

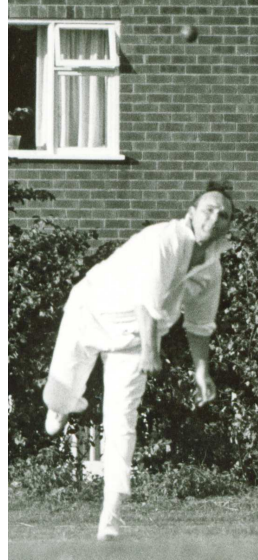

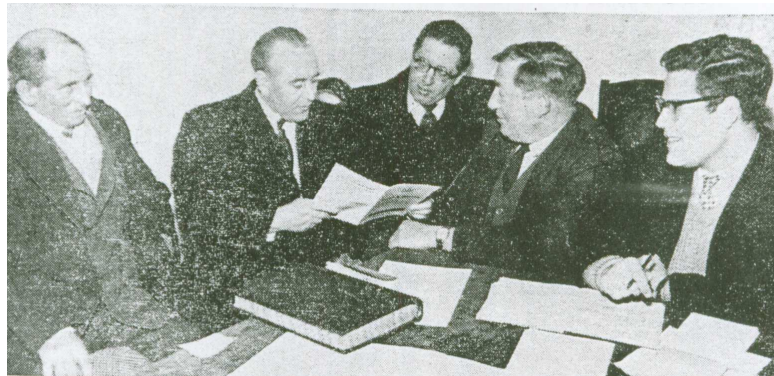
