The decision was taken to disband the club due to the lack of available players and that the funds and interests of the club be vested in a Special Committee of five persons: B Bloore, L Bloore, F Gill, W Gunn & H Tomlinson.

Mr Gunn agreed to house all the equipment.

£66 cash saved and jointly the property of the Cricket Club & the Football Club was to be retained in the Savings Bank at West Bridgford.

Very promising all-rounder son of the Reverend Brooker, Robin Neville Benedict Brooker died on active service with the RAF near Rotterdam in the Netherlands on 3 February 1943 aged just 21 years, he was a Flight Sergeant.
